<u>16 March 2025 - Second Sunday in Lent Year C</u> Luke 9:28-36 'As Jesus was praying, the appearance of his face was altered'

In today's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to the disciples saying. 'Listen to him'. This was a focused moment for the disciples when they heard God speaking to them and experienced Jesus in glory. Lent helps us to slow down and seek out time for quiet prayer. Headteacher's Update

Dear Parents and Carers.

Our focus as a school this week has been on reiterating our expectations on uniform and behaviour with students in all year groups. Our approach to standards here at Holy Family can be summed up in three words: Ready, Respectful and Safe. Every classroom has posters explaining what this looks like both in and out of lessons, and this week myself and the senior team ran standards-setting assemblies with all year groups to reiterate why these simple rules are so important.

I will be sharing slides from the assembly on the school website next week so that you are able to see the messages shared with your child - please go over these with your child at home.

One aspect of keeping the school community safe is that from time to time, senior staff will carry out random bag searches. If your child has anything in their bag or pockets that is banned under our behaviour policy, these items will be confiscated and in some cases we will dispose of them.

If students have in their possession any illegal substances or anything that could harm others, they face serious consequences up to and including permanent exclusion.

Mobile phones and smartwatches are not permitted in school for a number of welldocumented reasons, and will be confiscated and only returned to a parent or carer in line with our Behaviour Policy. Similarly, jewellery will be confiscated and returned within a given time frame.

Your support in ensuring that your child adheres to our policy and procedures is extremely important - my primary job as Headteacher is to ensure that students are able to access their learning, and that they are safe in school. By following our mantra of Ready, Respectful, Safe at all times, all of our children and young people can make the most of their time at school.

Upcoming reminders are as follows:

Year 9 Parents' Evening will take place on the 20th of March - a vital opportunity for discussions around progress and future choices. Following this, internal Sixth Form interviews are scheduled for 24th March - 4th April. Finally, a reminder that the deadline for Year 9 options is the 31st of March. Please ensure all forms are completed and returned by this date so we can support every child in making the best choices for their future.
