There will be some mistakes on the way to year 8, but just know I believe in you!

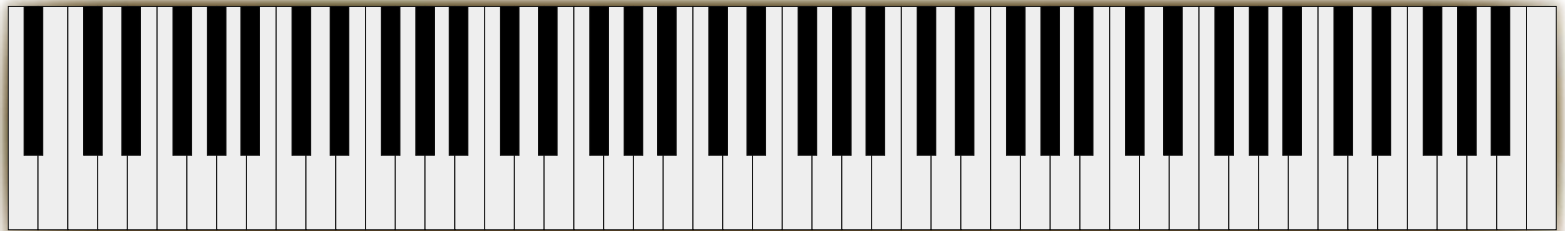
