Overall attainment has improved, with a higher percentage of students achieving top grades compared to last year. The percentage of students gaining AAB or higher in the traditional 'facilitating subjects' increased compared to last year and a greater number of students gained entry to Russell Group universities.

Science Marvels: Hands-on Mitosis with Miss Danila and Miss Johnson








SPORTS


Library Book Donations


