CHAPLAINCY



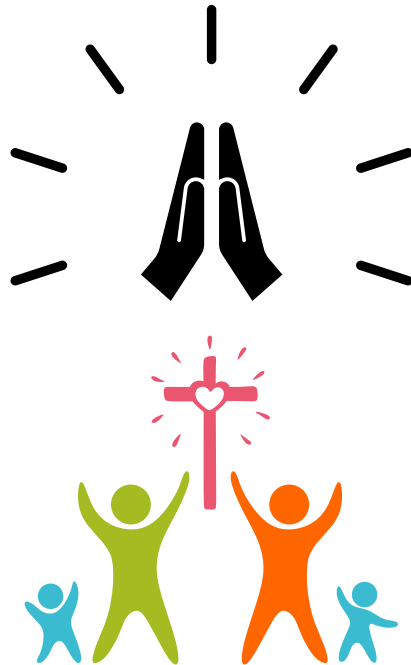
On behalf of the school community, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the local Deanery clergy for their support during this academic year.

Citizenship Awards

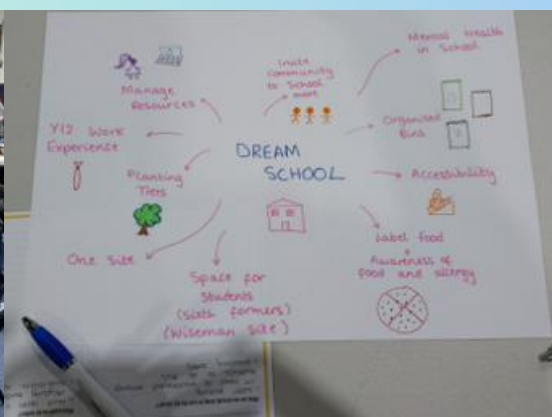
Each year, Bishop Alan celebrates the young people in our Diocese through the Citizenship Awards, recognising inspirational young people throughout the Diocese.

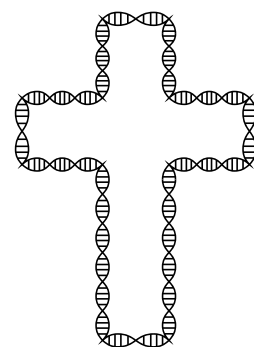

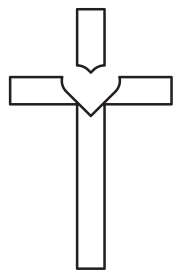
Celebrating 180 Years since the first SVP conference!

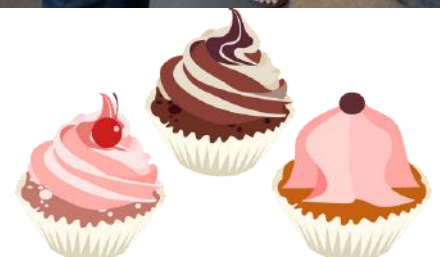
SVP Student Reflections

Holy Family Election Votes 2024

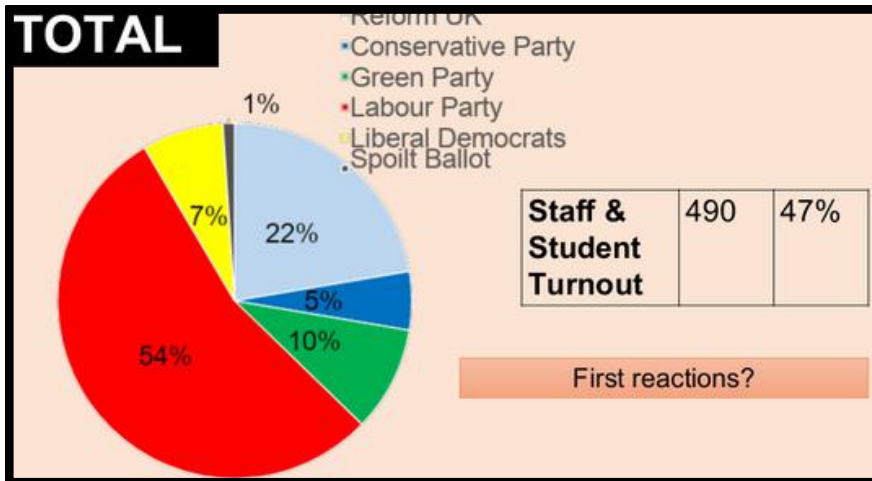
As the General Election was announced in the UK for the 4th July, Mr. Shah and his politics students announced the Holy Family Mock Election!

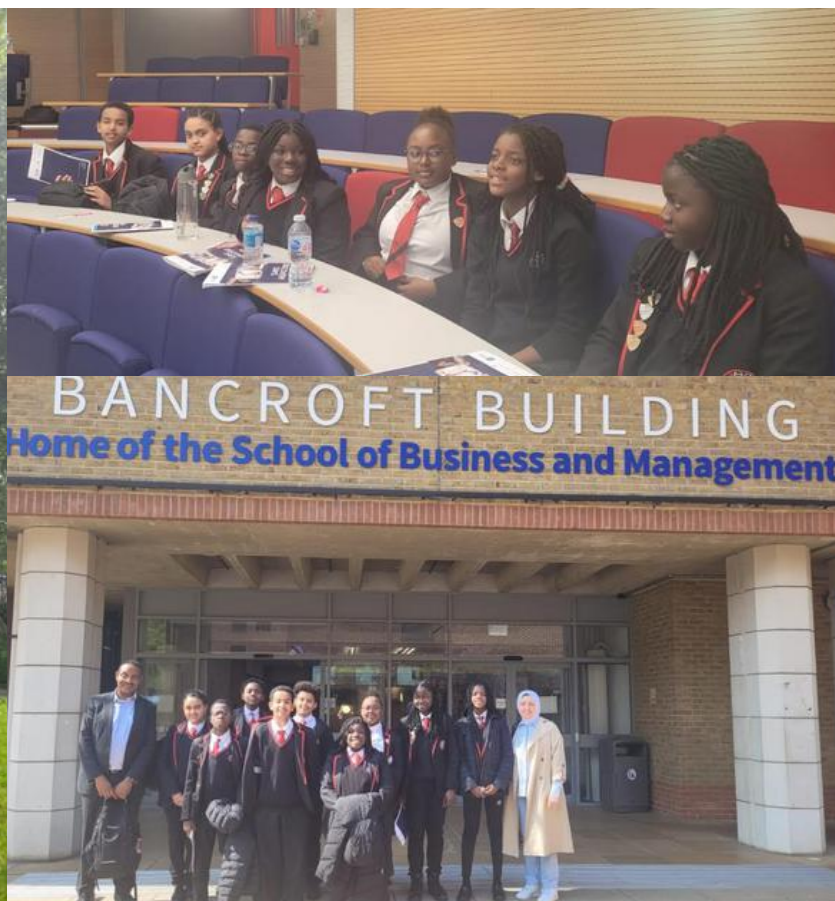

Discovery Day - Queen Mary University

Fourteen students from our school who have completed a Crest Award, attended a reward trip on 9th May to participate in Discovery Day at Queen Mary University as part of the Festival of Chemistry Programme. The aim of the programme was to inspire students to pursue chemistry and related sciences, allowing them to explore the opportunities the subject can offer. Our students competently completed high-level science practical experiments, demonstrating their lab skill and knowledge. They made us proud during the sessions!

I really enjoyed my time there as I had the chance to have a little tour around the university campus, the latest laboratories and real life-mini-lectures in an actual lecture theatre! 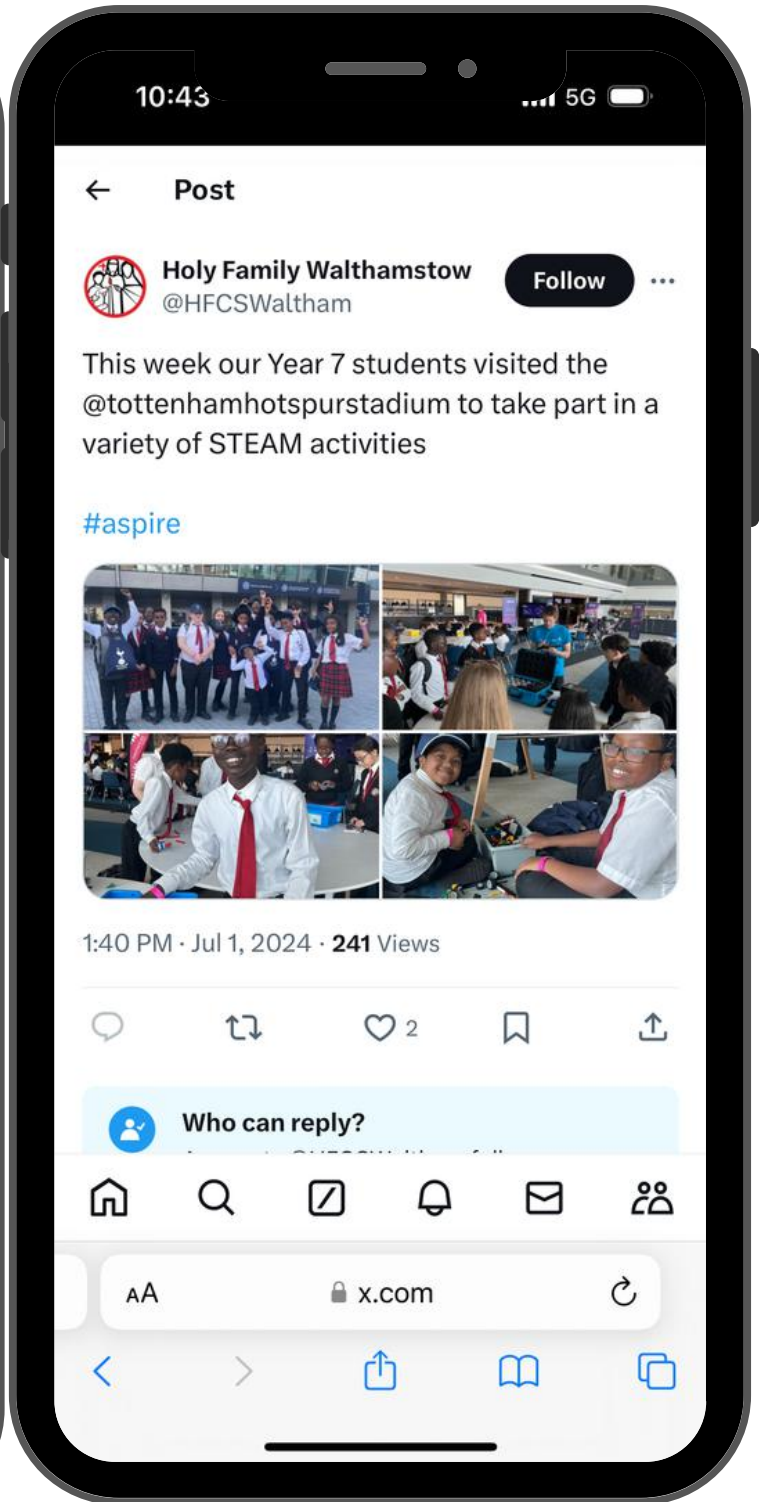
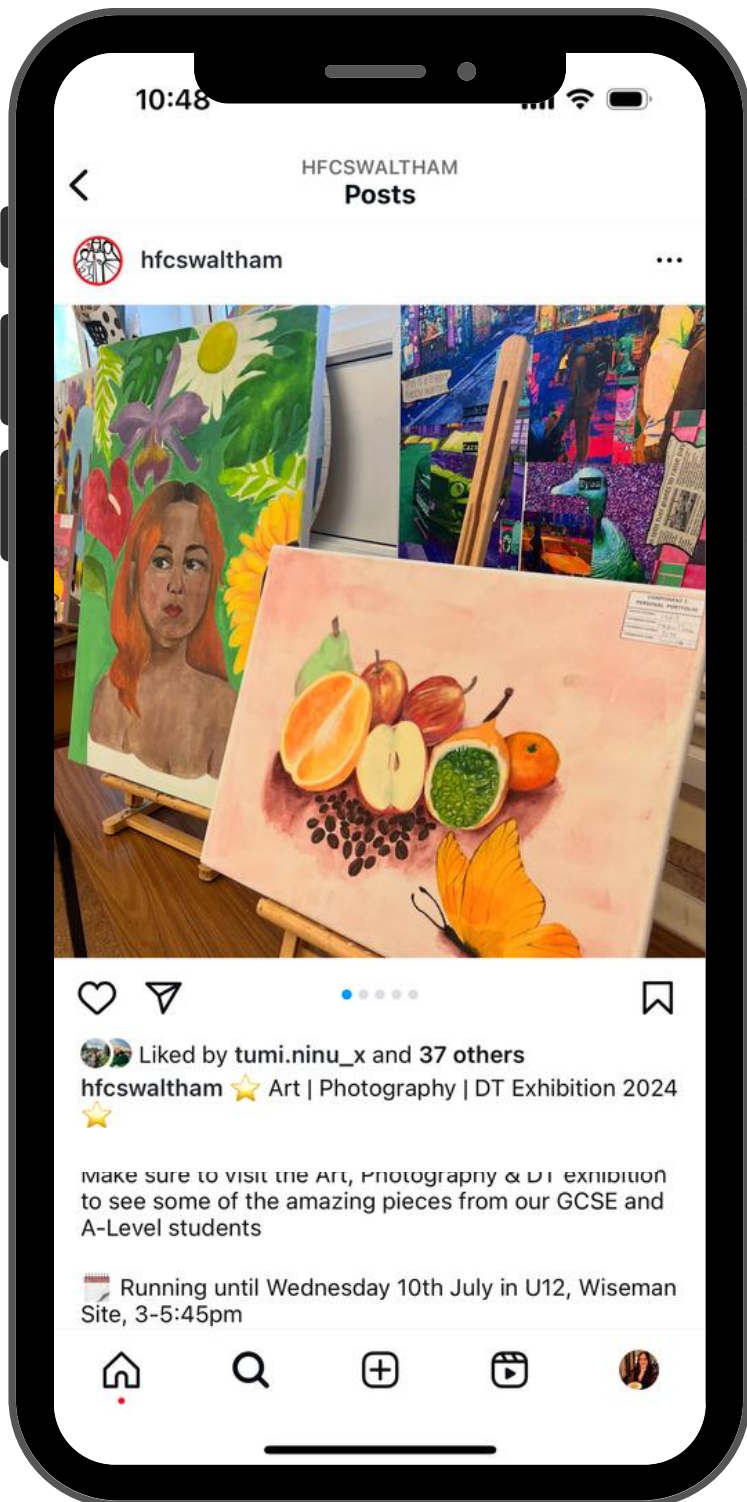
