Main Purpose of the Job:

• To provide technical and classroom support across the school in art and photography, under the direction of the curriculum leader.

Specific responsibilities

- 1. To assist with the preparation of lessons, including the setting up of equipment
- 2. To photocopy resources and materials for use in the department
- 3. To source and collect resources for use in lessons
- 4. To assist students in group and class workshops when required
- 5. To provide one-to-one assistance with dedicated tasks including students taking photographs
- 6. To support students and staff in the use of ICT and photo/video editing equipment
- 7. To assist with the maintenance and use of the dark room
- 8. To print photographs taken by students
- 9. To display students' work under the direction of the CL.
- 10. To check and maintain the photographic and ICT equipment, reporting faults where necessary
- 11. To establish and maintain an inventory of stock and equipment according to the schools' financial regulations
- 12. To ensure the security of equipment by following agreed procedures
- 13. To provide administrative support to the department as required
- 14. To accompany school trips as required
- 15. To assist with displays around the school at particular times of the year (e.g. before an open evening or other showcase event).
- 16. Undertake any other duties commensurate with the grade, as directed by the Head Teacher.
